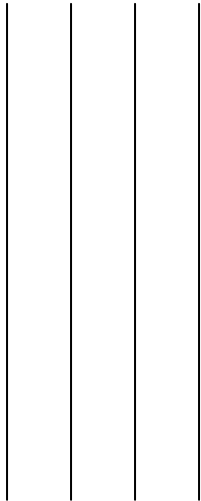

Learning To Get Along With Less

Where did all of the money go? State officials say that it just is not there, "it just is not coming in anymore," a state official told me recently.

In the same week, I was visiting with a university official who stated, "Although these cuts have been tough, we're a better and stronger organization because of them. We've had to make the tough decisions and make the cuts we have been putting off for years."

We all know that investments have been tough for three successive years. Not since the Great Depression have equity investments fallen so far over an extended period.

Foundations across America and Colorado are giving away less money. Private foundations must give away five percent of their assets every year no matter what happens on Wall Street. But when assets fall there is less equity to apply the five percent gifting rule and grant funds diminish.

The bad news is that mutual funds and stocks have dropped in value for three successive years. The good news is that this year the market has gone sideways for the first quarter and business seems to be improving. The war has been waged and won in one short month. As we publish this annual report America is in the process of reconstruction within Iraq. Business seems to be improving, high technology is starting to make a comeback, and new jobs are starting to surface. We are not out of the woods but at least the forest is not on fire.

On a positive note, there is still considerable funding going on across Colorado in Federal and State dollars. Foundations still have billions and grants are being distributed throughout the year. There is less money, but this is still a very rich, successful country and most people at least have some sort of roof over their heads, fresh drinking water, access to food, and some clothing.

Metro Denver is a Mecca for homeless and hungry citizens who for many reasons end up on the street with one of those signs asking for money. Usually within a short distance of a shelter that provides free food, a mattress, clothing, job guidance, showers, and a safe place to store belongings. The shelters do not supply cigarettes, drugs or alcohol so those living on the street have to raise a little bit of cash to service their personal habits.

I would love to solve the problem of homeless people with new lives, opportunities, and identities. Life is challenging and as a society we have to consider whom to assist: the person on the street, or the child or youth who we want to keep off the street forever. Foundations face a tough task of deciding where funds should go and at what time in a person's life the money will do the most good. Foundations have different missions, viewpoints, policies, and philosophies on where the funds should be distributed and to whom.

The glass is half empty this year---in most cases there is still enough water in the glass to drink and to survive. Government funding continues, foundations are open for business---there are people to serve everywhere.

FROM THE PRESIDENT: (CONT-D)


Non-profits must decide whether the battle for funding is worth continuing. Boards must make tough choices in cutting expenses, positions, and services.

It is a time for evaluation of services, staff, and fulfillment of our missions.

ABOUT OUR FOUNDER:



Kenneth Kendal King was born in Nederland, Texas on August 12, 1901. His father died when Kenneth was eight years old. His early childhood days revolved around working with his widowed mother at a family-run boarding house, both in Texas and later in Denver. In 1916, he and his mother and two brothers moved to Denver. Kenneth graduated from East High School in 1918. Determined to get a good education, he enrolled at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois. He worked his way through four years of college, driving a taxi cab in Chicago, waiting tables at his fraternity house, and selling men's clothing in the Chicago Loop.

In 1929 Kenneth King founded Columbia Savings and Loan Association in Denver, Colorado with offices in Denver, Fort Collins, Colorado Springs, Pueblo, and Littleton with field staff serving all of Colorado. In 1958, Kenneth with his brother, Harold Taft King, built the Petroleum Building at Sixteenth and Broadway.

In 1962 Columbia was sold to MCA, Inc. Kenneth remained on the Board until 1979, completing 50 years with Columbia Savings.

Kenneth King continued his work as an active philanthropist, supporting such organizations as Goodwill Industries, the Leukemia Society, Easter Seal Society, and countless church, civic and social services organizations.

While active with Columbia Savings, he hired a number of handicapped employees and in 1963 was named Colorado Employer of the Year by then Governor John Love, and later received the Distinguished Service Award from President Lyndon Johnson, who cited him for "encouraging and promoting the employment of handicapped people."

He was a life member of Sigma Chi Fraternity. The Omega Chapter House at Northwestern University bears his name.

During his presidency of the Denver Lions Club, he formed the Denver Lions Foundation, recognizing the need for Foundations to raise and distribute funds to worthwhile causes, such as the Lions' blind and hearing programs.

In 1990, Kenneth King founded the Kenneth Kendal King Foundation and became the organization's first president. Upon his death on April 25, 1992, Stevens Park Kinney II became the Foundation's second president and the Board of Directors selected by Kenneth King became active.

In the latter part of 1993, President Kinney succumbed to a serious illness, and the five-member board elected Vice President Robert F. Sweeney to assume the current presidency in 1994.

The Board meets quarterly and at special meetings to review business operations and review grant proposals.

Kenneth King's motto throughout his life - and strongly carried out by his Foundation is:

"To do the common thing in an uncommon way"
